Course Description

- Local Culture Mumbai Meri Jaan is a 1 credit certificate course on understanding the city of Mumbai and its diversity.
- The course is a total field based course focusing exclusively on the local culture of the Mumbai city and immediate suburbs with on-site lectures.
- The course will encompass cultural aspects of the city which include Colonial History of the Urbs Prima in Indes, Religions and Communities, Film and Music, Intellectual Centres, Art Galleries, Food Botanical Wonders and much more.
- Special visits will cover Caves, Gauthans, and Forts of Mumbai. Students will also be encouraged to experience the unique food culture of a particular locality, community after each visit.
- Participants will be asked to assemble at a given location at a predetermined time particular to each of the sessions and will be exposed to the various aforementioned aspects of the city's culture with guidance from expert resource people.
- At the end of the course, participants will make group/individual presentations and a certificate distribution/ valedictory ceremony will be organised in which students will be handed over their certificates.
- Certificates will be issued to students who attend all the field visits and obtain a minimum of 40% marks in the project work.

Course Objectives

- To understand the cultural transformation of the city by examining its physical and nonphysical public spaces.
- To introduce the basic aspects of the inclusive culture and heritage of the city, thereby fostering a spirit of tolerance in the participants.
- To step away from mainstream cultural attributes of the city and expose students to more alternate and lesser known forms of culture.
- To allow the participants an opportunity to have a learning experience beyond the classroom

Perceived Outcome:

- Exposure of student participants of the course to various cultural aspects of the city thereby enabling sensitization through a more holistic understanding of the dynamic city of Mumbai.
- Students will submit an individual/group project report


