Innovative Teaching Methods/best practices:

Poetry reading sessions, workshops and other activities:

Samrita Sinha:

"Tea, Coffee and Literature": Every year, the SYBA students are invited to a tea party where, along with refreshments, discussions on the background concepts from the syllabus are held. Students are expected to come prepared with their thoughts on the texts and concepts.

"Literature beyond the Classroom": Two poetry reading sessions were organised with the SYBA English Divisions A and B students. Students were also encouraged to bring their own poems to the reading. At the end of these sessions, students were served tea/coffee and samosas.

The students of Communication Skills were asked to write letters to each other in class in order to facilitate learning via their peer group.

Nishtha Dev:

For the unit on report writing on Communication Skills, Ms Dev asked her students to write reports based on the crimes and the ensuing investigation depicted in an episode from *Castle*, for a fictional newspaper. The class was divided into groups for the class presentation and feedback was provided to them.

She also organised a dance workshop in her Communication Skills class as an activity for report writing (activity reports).

Debates and creative writing sessions were organised in the Communication Skills class to celebrate National Integration Day and Constitution Day.

Dr Elwin Susan John:

The students of Communication Skills were asked to write letters to each other in class in order to facilitate learning via their peer group.

A/V aids, ICT, film screenings:

Ms Sinha screened documentaries and television series in her Communication Skills classes to help students critically analyse gender issues including representations of gender in media. She screened episodes from the television series, *Castle*, and designed a class assignment for eyewitness accounts based on the episodes. Films like *Jane Eyre* and A *Separation* were screened to sensitise students to issues like gender and censorship. The film *Cat on a Hot Tin Roof* was screened to help students link it with the play *Death of a Salesman*. She also screened films in her Mass Communication classes.

Ms Dev screened the following films/documentaries in her Communication Skills classes to make students think about the ideas discussed in the comprehension passages given to them: *Modern Family, Sita Sings the Blues, The Beauty and the Beast.* She screened old advertisements and scenes from *Hum Log* in her Mass Communication class. She screened the BBC adaptation of *Pride and Prejudice, Bridget Jones's Diary* and the BBC documentary *Having a Ball* for her Paper XIII classes on *Pride and Prejudice*.

Dr Elwin Susan John made a detailed PPT on the history of English literature (which included the information on the important events of the era, the prominent writers of each period, their works and the popular genres of the times) for Paper IV.

Student presentations:

Ms Sinha encouraged the Mass Communication students to make presentations on the history of radio and Indian cinema. She asked the TYBA S/M students to make presentations on the theoretical aspects of Modernism and Postmodernism. The class presentations were duly evaluated and feedback was provided to students.

Ms Dev asked the students of Mass Communication to present their views on television advertisements and popular Hindi songs.

Handouts:

Handouts were prepared by members of the department to aid their teaching in the following papers:

Mass Communication (Nishtha Dev): handouts containing readings for various topics in the syllabus

Paper II (Dr John): handout on background readings on Indian Writing in English

Paper II (Vani Zaveri): a PDF was prepared for the IA Assignment (five poems each by three poets and three plays); students were asked to analyse any of the recommended texts in two to three thousand words

Paper III (Samrita Sinha): theoretical essays as background reading material and handout on American poetry

Paper IV (Dr John): poetry handout containing poems from the syllabus and texts from outside the syllabus

Debates:

Ms Zaveri conducted debates in her Mass Communication class to help students understand the concepts like freedom of expression and censorship

Contact groups:

The TYBA English S/M students met their mentors once a week to review their academic progress and to ask them questions related to the syllabus, the writing of answers, reference work etc.

Google groups:

Google groups were used to share academic material, announcements related to departmental and college activities, information on job and internship opportunities, and cultural events held in the city. Ms Vachharajani created an email chain titled "We Love Poetry" was created via Google groups to encourage students to share poems they liked with their classmates and teachers.

Unsupervised tests: Unsupervised tests were conducted for the TYBA English S/M class.

Texts for IAs (FYBA English, TYBA English etc.) are taken from outside the syllabus.

<u>N-List:</u> FYBA, SYBA and TYBA students were asked to activate their N-List accounts at the start of the academic year. They were encouraged to make use of the facility.

Syllabus formulation:

The college was granted autonomy in 2018-19 and departments laid the groundwork for the revision of their syllabi. The Department of English prepared the draft syllabi for the revised FYBA Communication Skills, FYBA English and the TYBA English courses.

Paper-setting and Moderation:

Members of the department were appointed as paper-setters and examiners under autonomy.

<u>Matribhasha Diwas</u>: The department celebrated Matribhasha Diwas in February 2019 by organising exercises and events in the Communication Skills classes.
