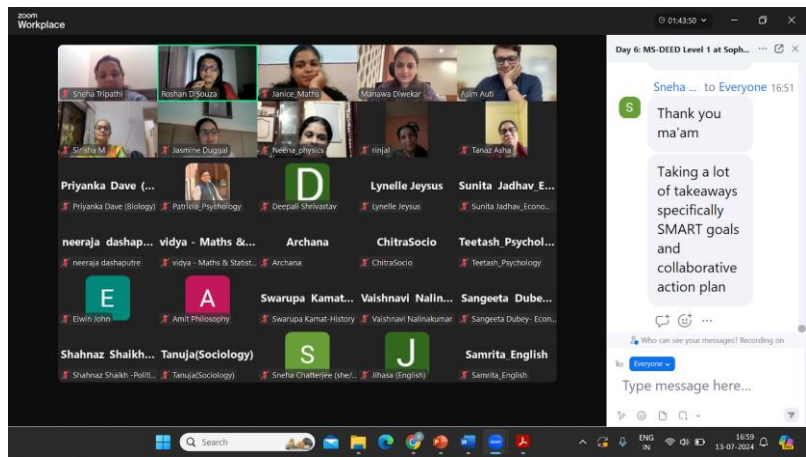

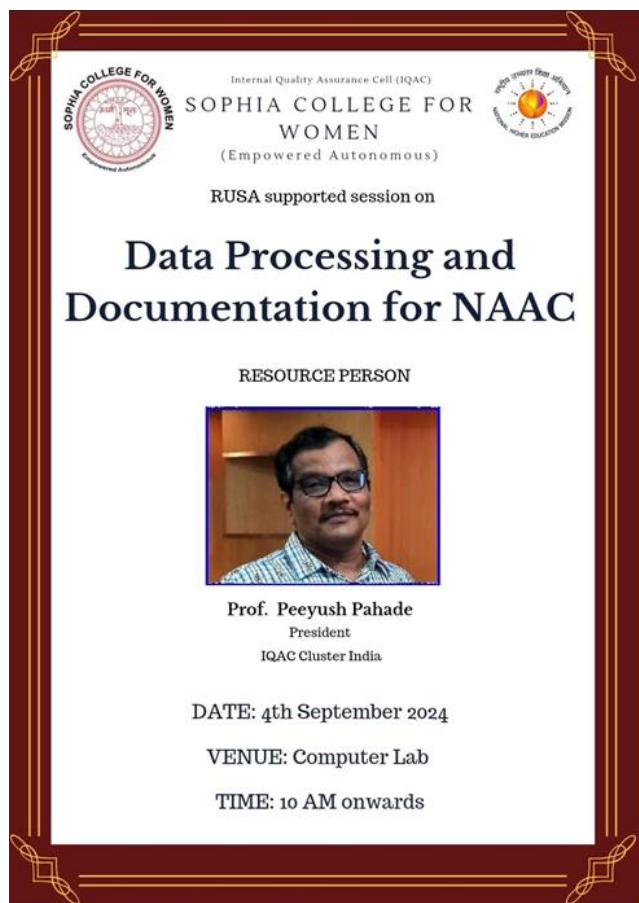

3. **RUSA Supported Annual IQAC International Conference on Artificial Intelligence for Pedagogical excellence & Research**

This was a two-day conference conducted in the blended mode on 19th and 20th September 2024

Objective: To help the staff understand the extent AI can be used in pedagogy and research.

Outcome: The staff are aware of the power of AI for pedagogy and the use of the software Vigyan for Research

Day 1: 19th August 2024 (Online Mode via Zoom platform, 4.30pm IST)

The inaugural address was given by the IQAC coordinator Dr Roshan D'Souza. The Keynote address was delivered by Dr Gareth White, University of Dundee, Scotland. His keynote address was titled "Untapping the potentials of digitalization: Insights from a Scottish International Education College." It was followed by a Question and Answer session. The keynote address was informative and gave the teaching faculty a

perspective of academics beyond the realms of Indian Education System. The session ended with a vote of thanks by Ms Tanaz Asha.

Day 2: 20th August 2024 (In person at Sophia College For Women Campus, 8:00 am to 4.00pm)

The day began with breakfast and registration of the participants. A total of **73 staff members** from the faculty of Humanities and science registered for the conference. The session began with lighting of the lamp followed by College Song.

Session 1:

"Immersive Future: The role of XR and AI in shaping Humanities and Social science education" by Ms Lakshmi Deshpande, Design Lead, TCS XR Lab, Mumbai. The session was divided into two parts. In the first half of the session Madam gave theoretical insights in the use of AR/VR/XR and in the second half a demo was done where the participants got a chance to experience a XR model designed by TCS lab, Mumbai. Ms Deshpande also answered the queries of the participants during the session.

Session 2:

The session was conducted on the main theme of the conference "Artificial Intelligence for Pedagogical Excellence and Research" by Dr Suresh Namboothiri, Director and Chief Mentor, Espoir Technologies Private Limited, Pune. The session was divided into three parts for enhanced and better quality of pedagogical resources. He also highlighted the use of AI in day to day classes for stimulating the teaching learning process. After the lunch break in the third part of the session, the use of the software Vigyan for enhanced research purposes was introduced to the participants. The entire session was filled with discussions and debates. The Conference ended with a Vote of thanks by the IQAC Coordinator followed by the National anthem. It was a very fruitful two day conference where the participants had a variety of interactive sessions which enriched everyone.

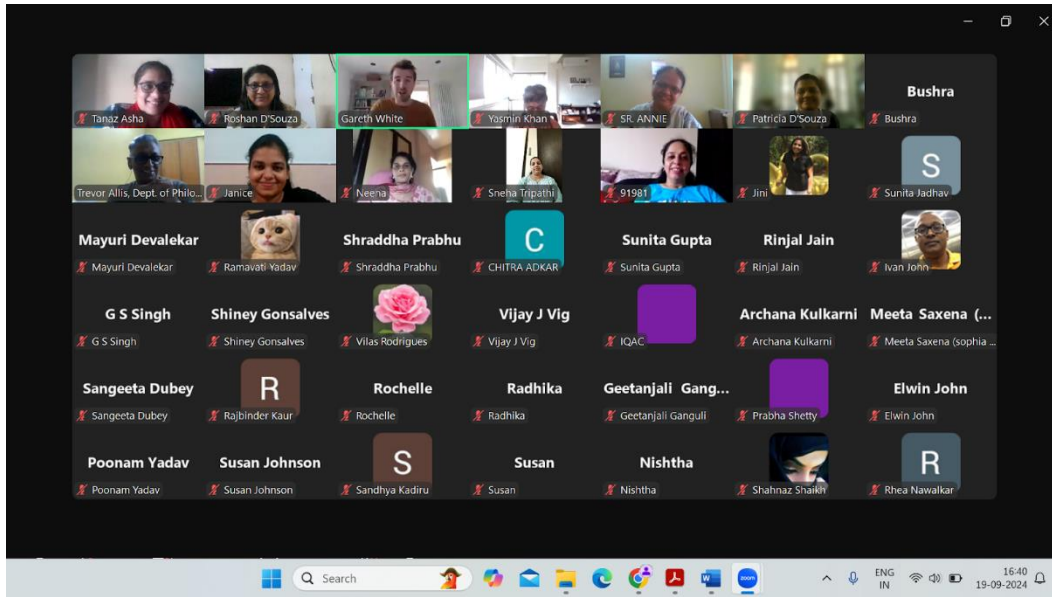

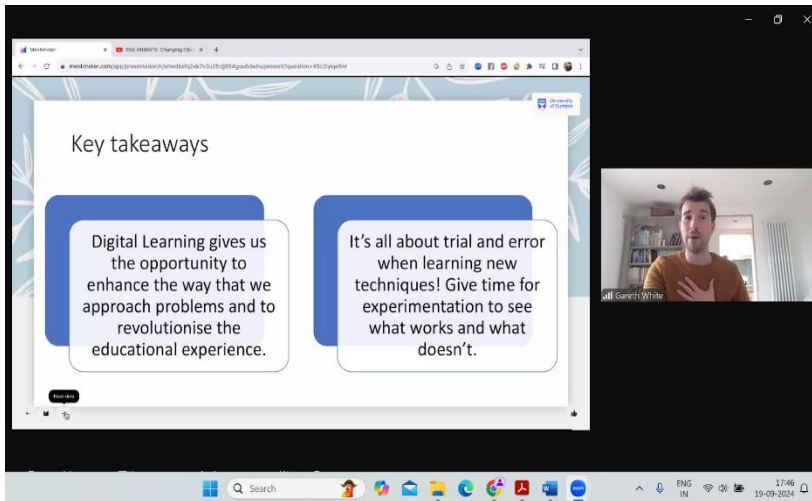

Day 2 Sessions at Sophia College campus





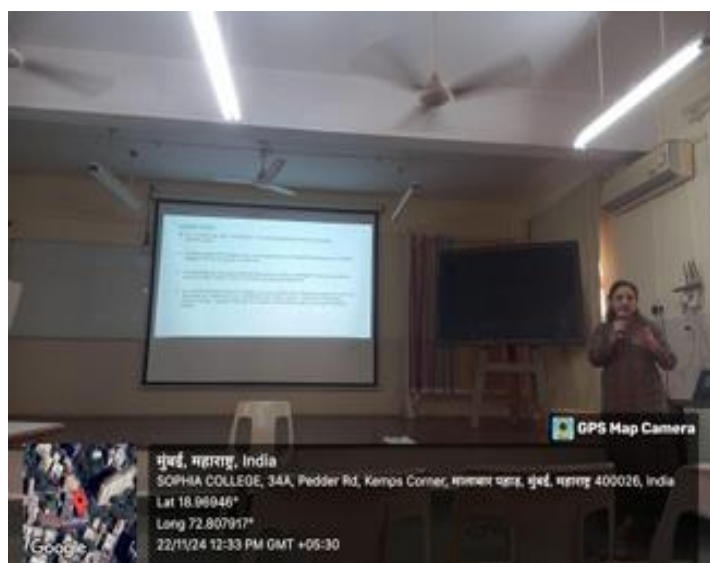
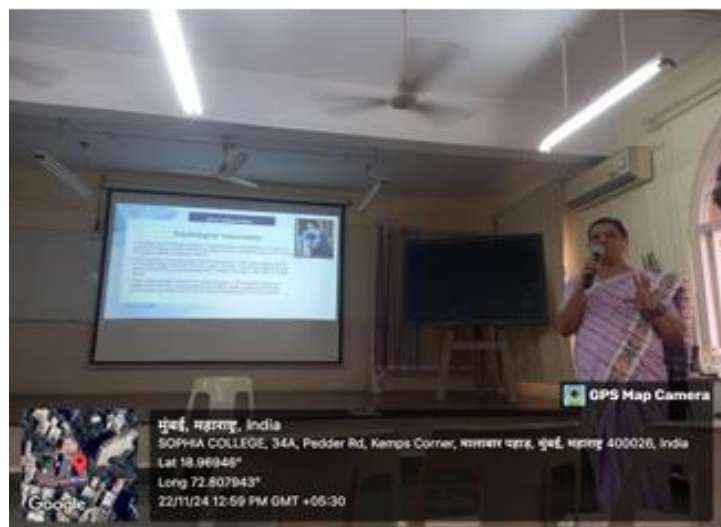

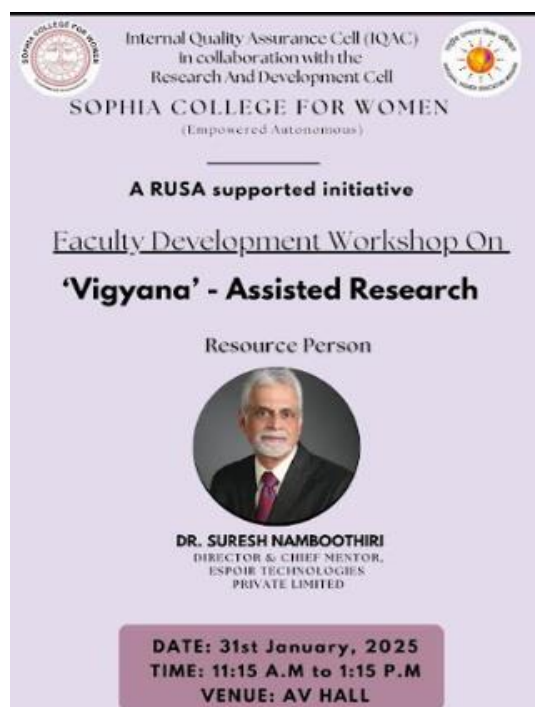

Documentation, NAAC and Feedback

1. The IQAC, QDC team, NAAC Criterion committees and all staff members worked together in the completion of the Self-study report which was submitted on 13th September 2024. DVV Clarifications were received from the NAAC body, various meetings were held with and among the criterion teams and the DVV clarifications were submitted on 29th October 2024.
2. The IQAC under the direction of the Principal held various meetings for all the staff members and the departments in December, January and February from 1:30 to 3:30 pm after the lectures to complete the documentation for the upcoming NAAC peer team visit. The IQAC also helped update the website information for all departments. Each member of the documentation sub-committee was assigned specific departments. They reviewed the website data for these departments, identified gaps, informed the departments and collaborated with the website committee to update the information. The progress has been updated in a Google Sheet. The syllabi for the NEP have been updated by the departments on the website according to the revised NEP template. A mock session was held where the heads of the departments presented the NAAC departmental presentation to the mentor Dr Badrunnisa Shaik on 5th February 2025. The Principal's presentation was also presented. Dr. Badrunnisa visited all the departments to evaluate the preparations for the Peer Team visit. A meeting was held for all the criterion teams on 11th April 2025 where Prof. Peeyush Pahade assessed the readiness of the institute and all the criterion teams for the online Peer Team Visit.
3. Collation of the 2023-2024 data- The IQAC documentation sub-committee collated the data received for the AY 2023-24.
4. Data was submitted for the NIRF rankings and India Today for the academic year 2023-24. The submission dates were January 17, 2025, for NIRF and March 20, 2025, for India Today.

5. Teacher's Assessment Questionnaires were administered for the AY 2024-25 for all the senior college teachers for all the classes (FY, SY, TY and PG)
6. Collection of the 2024-25 data- Reallocation for the criterion sheet/forms was done among the Documentation sub-committee members. The respective criteria and forms for the AY 2023-24 have been handled by the following committee members

This reallocation was done to increase the overall efficiency of the process keeping in mind that some documentation subcommittee members are part of the respective NAAC criterion teams.

The data for the AY 2024-25 will be collected from the HODs and staff members using Excel sheets, which will be sent via email. Staff members will download the file, fill in the details, and send the filled sheet to the IQAC documentation subcommittee in the same thread. The data for the AY 2024-25 will not be collected via the Google Classrooms.

It was also decided that the D1 and D4 data will be collected in Excel files instead of the Google forms from the AY 2024-25 onwards. As per the new reallocation, Ms Sidranaaz Qazi and Ms Nishtha Dev will create the Excel file templates for D1 and D4 respectively. A separate sheet will be created for each category within a single Excel workbook, and department activities will be categorized as Academics, Outreach, Extension, etc. It was suggested that the hard copy of the evidence will be collected for D1 and D4 from this year onwards. Files will be kept in the IQAC Office for this. The department reports for the D4 will be signed by the activity coordinator and the Head of the Department. The subcommittee members will assess the completeness of the data received, check if the file links are available and active, and if the data is incomplete, obtain it from the relevant staff members or departments.
